Pastor McGill Writes. . .

Resolved to Grow in 2009

Have you made a firm decision to move forward and grow in 2009? Paul in writing to Timothy put his finger on the key to growth. If you want to grow as a complete person, you will need to grow spiritually.

Paul instructed Timothy to: "Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called" (1 Timothy 6:12) If you are going to grow in 2009 you will have to learn how to "fight the good fight of faith!"

The best resolution you can make today is that in 2009 your knowledge of God's Word will grow. In Romans 12:2 Paul exhorts us with these words: "Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the good and acceptable and perfect will of God." You see, the devil knows that if he can keep you too busy to spend time in God's Word he can keep you defeated and weak in faith.

In Romans 10:17 we read, "...faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God." So we see that faith comes from hearing the

word of God preached and reading the Bible daily. The only fight we as Christians are called to fight is the Fight of Faith!

If you're in another kind of fight, you're in the wrong fight! There's no need to fight the devil—Jesus has already defeated him. There is no need fighting sin—Jesus is the cure for sin. But there is a fight and that involves the enemies or hindrances to faith.

The greatest enemy to faith is a lack of understanding God's Word. In fact, all hindrances to faith center around this lack of knowledge; because you cannot believe or have faith beyond your actual knowledge of the Word of God. Can you see how important it is for the Christian to have a clear knowledge and understanding of the Scriptures?

Your faith will automatically grow as your understanding of God's Word grows (Rom 10:17). If your faith is not growing, it is because your knowledge of God's Word is not growing. And you cannot grow or develop spiritually if you are not growing in faith.

Make that resolution

right now: "In 2009 I am determined that my knowledge of God's Word will grow." Apply yourself to the study of God's Word! It will automatically follow that your faith will grow. Hence, you will grow and develop spiritually and your actions will demonstrate the "good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

Make this your confession: I am determined my knowledge of God's Word will grow. My understanding of God's Word will grow. Therefore, faith will come and my faith will grow. I will grow and develop spiritually this year and live and do the work of God. I am resolved to grow in Faith in 2009!

Begin this Sunday to carry your Bible to church. When the Scripture is read and you hear the Word preached, look it up and get it deep down in your spirit. Then when you need faith to put you over, the Word will come forth out of your mouth through faith and give you victory. Praise God!

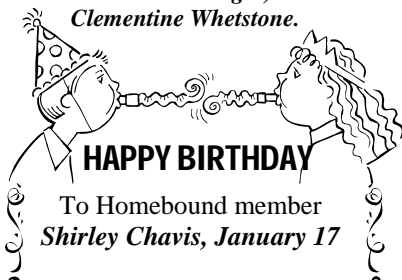

to the stranger. “Grace, we need you!”

It was only a moment before Grace and the stranger were in animated conversation. Several minutes passed before Grace looked up and said, “Sarah, you’ll never believe what I’m about to tell you! This lady has just come to the States. She’s been in Philadelphia only a few weeks. She’s a Christian and has been praying that God would show her a church where she could find someone who speaks her dialect of Chinese. She says that God told her He would show her the place.”

“She told me,” Grace went on, “that she has walked the streets for a mile or two around here every Sunday, stopping outside each church she’d find. She said that she’d pause by every church signboard, bow her head and pray, ‘Dear God, is this the place?’ It was today that she reached us and as she prayed by our sign she finally heard God say, ‘Yes, this is the place. Go in.’”

When Sarah finished I must tell you I had a tear in my eye and even as I now write a lump in my throat. Is not this story suggestive of how the Lord Jesus comes to

us, as He did in Bethlehem, disguised and as a stranger? He often comes in the guise of other people, especially people—strangers—in need. It was not for nothing Jesus, in one of His last and most powerful parables, spoke of being found in the needy, that in ministering to the hungry, thirsty and sick we in reality are ministering to Him (Matthew 25: 31-46).

May Christmas linger long for each of us as we move forward into the new year, listening for voices that we hear say, “Dear God, is this the place?”

It is “stewardship.” Or what would you call at least twelve people serving a Christmas dinner to staff and others at church? Or another group of ladies and men who give of their time to serve funeral luncheons to those who are remembering a loved one who has passed? That’s stewardship! That is

sharing their time and gifts to brighten another’s day.

Or, how about the choirs and the instrumentalists who share their talents, or ushers and greeters and officers who continue through the year faithfully at their duties; that is all stewardship.

You see, what we want to make clear is that stewardship is an attitude. It’s not so much what we do, as it is why we are doing something.

To connect the term “stewardship” strictly with a fund drive or a census, then, is not really doing it justice. Because census work and fund drives are projects we do, complete, and then they are over with. It can’t be the

same for stewardship.

Stewardship is an ongoing happening or process. It is a continuous revelation that God has given us special “gifts;” special talents. By these gifts or talents, we can reveal God to the world. The touch of God can be felt in another’s life, and sensitivity to the needs of others is the healing, helping hand of God. Does this sound like a definition of Christian charity? If so, it is because that’s stewardship. *Beautiful is a phenomenon that is never apparent itself, but is reflected in a thousand different works of the Creator. (Goethe)*

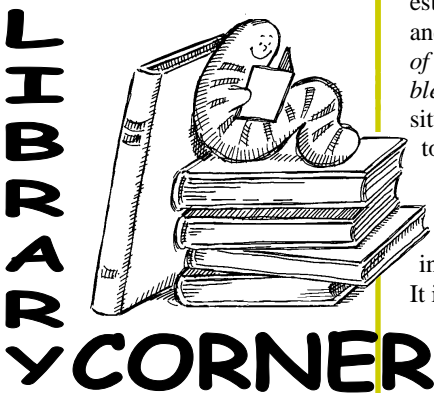

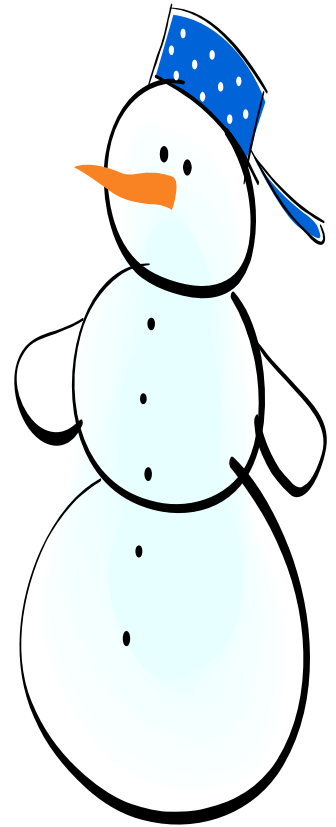

Miracles Happen

“Dear God, Is This the Place?”

As I write this for January’s *Word of Hope*, it is just the middle of December. With Christmas not yet upon me it is a good thing too because there is much for me to do between now and then: 2 sermons to prepare, gifts to wrap and cards to send. But my heart has also known the spiritual joy of the Season as from time to time I’ve paused to remember the Christmas story, and, just now, its connection with something experienced by a Methodist minister of my acquaintance, while she served a church in Philadelphia.

Sarah Beaman (now retired) related to me how one Christmas Sunday, during ser-

vice, she had looked out at her congregation and observed a person she didn’t recognize. She was obviously a visitor because she was oriental and the church had no oriental members.

After worship the visitor hung back until everyone had left for home, then made her way to Sarah at the door. She took Sarah’s hand and looked up inquiringly. Sarah smiled, said “Good morning!” and how nice it was to meet her. The woman smiled and bowed and after a moment spoke ... in Chinese. And it was soon clear that Chinese was all she could speak. Now what, thought Sarah, drawing her back into

the sanctuary and motioning for her to be seated.

Then an idea struck her. She had in the congregation a woman who had lived some years before in China and served as a Methodist missionary there. But how was she to get the two together? Grace had been one of the first out the door so she was unavailable ... or so it seemed.

“Then,” Sarah told me, “just as I was pondering this I looked up and whom should I see? There was Grace, the retired missionary! I couldn’t believe my eyes!”

She called to Grace and told her what a miracle it was that she was there and pointed
